This month, the Children have been exploring different shapes, colours to paint with while listening to different types of music which then lead to different styles of art.



Leadership and Independence

Throughout our classrooms, we have been working on Hygiene and self help skills, but also working on a mindmap each day, asking the Children different questions. This helps get their opinion and their interests. In recent question, to how the teacher can make you happy, the responses we had were, doing construction, and doing cooking.



Munch and Move

Through our Munch and Move program, we have been busy exploring the fundamental skills of our body as well as meeting the Children's individual milestones. The Classrooms have been busy, helping Children walk, run, skip, aswell as learning to line up - hands on shoulders in front of you, this works particularly well for in an emergency situation.

Our Children In Action



This month, our Children have enjoyed a wide variety of meaningful learning experiences that have supported their growth across all developmental areas. Through play based learning, Children have been developing their fine and gross motor skills by participating in activities such as jumping, balancing, walking, kicking, stacking, puzzles, block play and construction challenges.

Our younger learners have been building confidence in their independence skills by practising everyday self help skills, including hand-washing and putting their shoes on and identifying their own belongings. Literacy and numeracy skill have been fostered through counting, pre-writing activities, colour matching, shape recognition and engaging story telling experiences.



The Children explored the world around them through sensory play and nature based learning, investigating the five senses with flowers and citrus.

Music, movement and creative expression remained a highlight throughout the month, with singing, dancing, drum painting and rhythm activities encouraging confidence, communication and self expression. As Part of our Artist of the Month, the Children explored Wassily Kandinsky, discovering how colours, shapes and music can be used to express emotions and creativity.

We also enjoyed cooking experiences, meditation, coding, tower-building challenges and imaginative play, all of which supported children's problem solving skills, creativity, teamwork and resilience. It has been wonderful to watch each child grow with confidence, curiosity and independence as they continue to learn through play.
